


Foursquare on End Times...





John Bunyan

Early church teachers by the names of *Ireneaus* and *Hippolytus*, second and third generation disciples of John the Revelator, wrote of the rise of the Antichrist and of the coming of the Lord from a Post-tribulation point-of-view.

They both taught that the Antichrist will reign on earth and persecute the Church right up to the return of the Lord in all his power and glory.


In his book, "Against Heresies," Irenaeus, writing about the Antichrist, said, "His tyranny shall last three years and six months, during which the saints shall be put to flight" (Ch. xxv.4).

Later, in the same book, he said, "The resurrection of the just takes place after the coming of Antichrist" (Ch. xxxv.1).

Hippolytus wrote a number of books; and in one called a "Commentary on the Book of Daniel," speaking of the Antichrist, he said, "When he has conquered all, he will prove himself a terrible and savage tyrant; and will cause tribulation and persecution to the saints, exalting himself against them" (Ch. 7).


In the same book, referring to the Two Witnesses of Revelation 11, Hippolytus said, "The two witnesses, then, shall preach three years and a half; and Antichrist shall make war upon the saints during (that time) and desolate the world" (Ch. 11).



Six Millennial Schools of Interpretation

Revelation 20:4-6

Revelation 20:4-6


They had not worshiped the beast or his image and had not received his mark on their foreheads or their hands. They came to life and reigned with Christ a thousand years. (The rest of the dead did not come to life until the thousand years were ended.)

Dispensational Premillennialism



2nd Resurrection Satan is loosed and deceives the nations

- 1812 Jesuit priest from Chile
- Manuel de Lacunza
- The Coming of the Messiah in Glory and Majesty
- Edward Irving Scottish Preacher translated the book in London in 1827 into and began to preach Pre-Tribulation Rapture.

- John Nelson Darby an English Preacher in the Plymouth Brethren Movement – 1820s and 1830s.
- April 1831 Margaret Macdonald (15 year old Scottish girl) Port Glasgow, Scotland.
- She believed God showed her a new revelation after several hours of prophecy and vision of a "split-coming" of Christ, and that Christians are raptured before the days of the Antichrist.


- Both Irving and Darby visited with her.
- John Nelson Darby adopted her view and expanded it to a secret rapture, two-stage, any moment return of Christ.
- He taught this view at a prophecy conference in 1883 in Ireland.
- The view spread to America. Darby visited five times to promote the teaching.

- Pastor James H. Brookes from St. Louis,
 MO embraced it and taught it.
- He mentored Cyrus I. Scofield who later became a minister and prominent leader in the movement of this teaching.
- In 1909, Oxford University Press published
 C.I. Scofield's annotated notes of the Bible
 (The Scofield Reference Bible).

 Fundamentalist churches made this the most publicized premillennial view in America.





The 1000 years is not literal but an undefined number:




